Environmental policy: Round table discussion characterized by citizen involvement

Vaudreuil-Dorion, April 26, 2017 – On Tuesday, April 25, the second and last roundtable discussion as part of the public consultation process for Vaudreuil-Dorion's environmental policy was held at Centre Multisports. Some 70 citizens took part in the discussions, sharing their ideas in a constructive and friendly atmosphere.

"Citizens of all ages and from all walks of life gathered to discuss the issues and challenges of importance to them. Many suggestions were brought forth, several of which are already being implemented by the municipal administration," noted Mayor Guy Pilon.

Ariane Leroux, Environmental Project Manager, took the opportunity to thank everyone for their involvement: "It's essential that we take the population's concerns into consideration in order to prioritize our actions. The preliminary results of the survey, which can be accessed online until the end of the month, already show that 93% of respondents consider it important or very important to develop an environmental policy. This confirms that we are heading in the right direction and that our daily efforts are on track."

Submitting briefs

Those who are interested still have a few days to submit their briefs to the Environment Division, either by email (environnement@ville.vaudreuil-dorion.qc.ca) or in person at City Hall. A brief can simply be a short document a few paragraphs long, and everyone is invited to contribute.
