## **Holiday season in Vaudreuil-Dorion**

**Vaudreuil-Dorion, December 9, 2019** – As the holiday season approaches, the City of Vaudreuil-Dorion would like to provide useful general information for its residents during this period.

### **Schedule**

The administrative offices will be closed from December 24 to January 2 inclusively. During the holiday season, citizens are invited to call 3-1-1 for requests requiring municipal intervention, other than emergency calls (911). The library will also be closed on December 24, 25, 26, 31 and January 1 and 2.

### **Collections**

Waste and food residue collections will take place according to the usual schedule. The recycling collection scheduled for Wednesday, December 25 is delayed to Friday, December 27. As of January 1, recycling collection will take place on Tuesdays for sector 5 and Fridays for sectors 1, 2, 3 and 4. The new map of the sectors can be consulted on the City's Web site. A special cardboard collection is scheduled for January 3 for sector 5 and January 7 for sectors 1, 2, 3 and 4. The cardboard boxes must be tied, using rope or tape, or stacked in a cardboard box and placed next to the roll-out bin. The Christmas tree collection will take place from January 6 to 17. Natural Christmas trees must therefore be placed at the curb before January 6. They can also be brought to the municipal workshops (205 Valois Street) or to Parc de la Maison-Valois between January 3 and 18. To facilitate collection, all decorations must be removed beforehand. Remember that Christmas trees are not accepted during the collection of large items.

### **Free swimming and skating**

The schedule is modified for the holiday season at the indoor pool and the municipal arena. It is available in the Recreation and Culture section of the City's Web site.

### **Ice skating rinks**

The condition of ice rinks always depends on weather conditions. The teams are working hard to make them optimal. Their opening will be announced on the City's Facebook page. To find out where the outdoor rinks and ice rings are located, simply consult the interactive map on the City's Web site.

### **Winter parking hotline and alternative parking areas**

Although on-street parking at night is prohibited from November 15 to April 1, a winter parking line (450 455-3372) has been in operation for several years in order to lighten the regulations and adapt to weather conditions. Thus, every day, starting at 5 p.m., a telephone message is updated to indicate whether or not it is permitted to park on the street as of midnight the same evening. Where there is a sign prohibiting parking, it takes precedence over the telephone message. When the parking ban applies, vehicles may be

parked in one of these parking lots:
