## Subsidy for Dog Microchipping

**Vaudreuil-Dorion, July 10, 2020** – During its public meeting on July 6, the City Council adopted a resolution for the implementation of a subsidy program related to the permanent identification of dogs on its territory. The City is therefore offering a \$10 refund to citizens who have their dogs microchipped by a veterinarian located in Vaudreuil-Dorion.

This subsidy program is part of the City Council's May 19th adoption of the Supplementary Regulation Concerning Dogs (Regulation 1771), which, among other things, provides that the owner of a dog aged over three months must have the animal permanently identified with a microchip.

Supporting documents must be provided with the duly completed form and submitted to the Permits and Inspection Department at [infourbanisme@ville.vaudreuil-dorion.qc.ca](mailto:infourbanisme@ville.vaudreuil-dorion.qc.ca) or in person at City Hall.

The financial assistance program applies retroactively from the date Regulation 1771 came into force (May 20, 2020) and will end no later than June 30, 2021, subject to available funds.
