## Ode au printemps: Vaudreuil-Dorion welcomes Spring with nine artistic installations to visit in May

**Vaudreuil-Dorion, April 30, 2021** – From May 1st to May 30th, the public is invited to discover nine artistic installations that were created from a collaboration between visual artists from Vaudreuil-Dorion and writers. The artworks have been installed on the territory along a 7 km circuit or so to make it easy for families to complete the tour on their bikes.

"*Ode au printemps* is the type of project that fits well into the current context where it is necessary to avoid gatherings. As the warmer weather begins to settle in, citizens are spending time visiting our parks, going for walks and riding their bikes. I think they will enjoy coming across these art installations during their outdoor activities," commented Mayor Guy Pilon.

Each of the art installations was created from a poem or text, which visitors will be able to read on site and even listen to through a podcast on their smartphone.

"The artists and writers who took part in this project used completely different artistic approaches. This temporary open-air exhibition will give people the opportunity to enjoy a variety of art forms while discovering the talent that exists here", explained Chloé Marcil, Head of Culture and Community Life.
