## Harwood Nature Park service offer: the citizens have their say

**Vaudreuil-Dorion, November 12, 2021 –** When it acquired Harwood Nature Park last August, the City of Vaudreuil-Dorion said it wanted to consult its citizens about their needs in terms of parks and outdoor activities. With this in mind, the City is inviting citizens to fill out a survey to find out their interests and concerns regarding Harwood Nature Park. The survey is available in French and English at ville.vaudreuil-dorion.qc.ca, in the News section, until December 6.

"We already have plans for the next few months, including the development of the dog run and some winter activities. However, we want to take the time to think about a long-term offer, and for that, we need to hear from the users of our infrastructure," commented Mayor Guy Pilon. "One thing is certain, no matter what services are offered, this space will remain a nature park."

Harwood Nature Park is located at 3900 Harwood Road (former Harwood Golf Club), halfway between Cote St. Charles and Chemin Daoust. The City acquired the site last August with a view to preserving it. The 196,396.1 m<sup>2</sup> (2,113,990 sq. ft.) site is already accessible to the community.

This citizen consultation for Harwood Nature Park is an integral part of Aspiration 5 "To encourage the involvement of all citizens in the well-being of the community" aimed at promoting a culture of public participation in the City of Vaudreuil-Dorion's 2020 > 2025 Strategic Planning.
