Maison Félix-Leclerc preparing to welcome visitors again

Vaudreuil-Dorion, February 18, 2022 – Following a break that lasted a few months, Maison Félix-Leclerc is preparing to reopen its doors to visitors. As of March 4th, guests will again be welcome to visit the venue located at 86, chemin de l'Anse on Friday evenings from 5 p.m. to 9 p.m. and on Saturdays and Sundays from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., for a tour or to take part in one of the cultural activities that will be offered.

Artists in Residence

Multidisciplinary artist Annick Gauvreau will be featured at La Maison Félix Leclerc throughout the month of March for her residency. In addition to an opportunity to meet with the artist and observe her creative process, those interested will have the chance to participate in a variety of her workshops. Since spaces are limited, online registration will be required in advance via the City's website at ville.vaudreuil-dorion.qc.ca, starting on February 21st at 9 a.m. for residents and February 24th at 9 a.m. for non-residents. In April and May, the artistic duo formed by Annouchka Gravel Galouchko and Stéphan Daigle will spend their residency at the venue creating a project which combines poetry with visual art. The artists will also be offering workshops to the public.

Exhibitions

As of March 4th, Mathieu Dubé will use the Adagio Hall to exhibit the work he created during his Artist Residency in November 2020. Annick Gauvreau will follow in April with her own exhibition. The Allegro Hall will host the works of citizen Maria Valencia from April 1st to May 29th. As soon as the weather allows it, visitors will also be invited to discover the *Promenade littéraire*, which currently features the works entitled *Conversations poétiques*.

La Mèz: evening activities for every taste

Meanwhile, La Mèz will host a variety of theme-inspired evenings on Thursdays or Fridays during April and May. On the musical side, Dave Harmo and the duo Pièce sur pièce will spend a few hours thrilling guests of Le Salon Félix. Stéphan Daigle will welcome his guests at the *Cabaret littéraire chez Félix* for a reading of *Albertine en cinq temps*, by author Michel Tremblay, presented by Les Philanthropes. The Cercle de conteurs du Haut-Saint-Laurent will host a get-together where guests will be welcome to present their stories. The organization Csur La télé will present a screening of the film *Les voisines... Messagères*, by filmmaker and director André Desrochers. Lastly, photography enthusiasts will have the opportunity to improve their smartphone camera skills by attending a conference presented by the Club photo Vaudreuil-Dorion. Online registration will also be required to attend evening activities.
