Feux et flocons 2022 : A special edition to be spread over two evenings

Vaudreuil-Dorion, February 23, 2022 – After an involuntary pause in 2021 due to restrictions imposed by the COVID-19 pandemic, the popular *Feux et flocons* event returns this year in a different format. The City of Vaudreuil-Dorion is inviting the public to attend the evening of their choice, since the event will be presented both on March 4th and 5th at 7 p.m., at Parc de la Maison-Valois.

"At the time of planning the event, the sanitary measures in force were much more restrictive than they are today, so much so that it was decided to hold the *Feux et flocons* event over two days to allow as many citizens as possible to enjoy the activity," explains Vincent Bastien, Director of Recreation and Culture.

DJ Kingdom, a well-known figure in the region, will be hosting the musical portion of the event with help from his special guests. DJ Yan Gagnon will take the audience on a journey through the 1980's and 1990's on Friday, and on Saturday, DJ Dan Desnoyers will continue the trip down Memory Lane with music from the 2000's. The famous fireworks display will light up the sky on both Friday and Saturday evenings around 9 p.m.

Mayor Guy Pilon is pleased to be able to offer this activity again: "The 2020 edition was held a week before the pandemic took over Quebec. We had broken a record in terms of attendance with nearly 5,000 people present. It was the last major event hosted by the City. It feels good to bring these gatherings back, especially since *Feux et flocons* is an activity that is always hugely enjoyed by our population," commented Mayor Guy Pilon.

A food truck will also be on hand for guests who want a bite to eat, as well as a bar offering hot alcoholic beverages. Both services will be subject to a fee.

Please note that unless otherwise advised by Public Health, the vaccination passport, along with proof of identity, will be required to access the site. The event may be cancelled if weather conditions are unfavorable. Citizens are urged to keep an eye on the City's Facebook page.
