Environmental Policy 2023-2027: The City of Vaudreuil-Dorion wants to know the concerns of its residents

Vaudreuil-Dorion, July 8, 2022 – The City of Vaudreuil-Dorion's first Environmental Policy, which was launched in 2018, will come to an end once the year is over. The municipal administration is currently working on an updated version of the policy. To make sure the future policy is in line with the concerns of the population, the City is seeking the collaboration of citizens, local organizations and businesses to take part in a short survey available on the City's website.

The Environmental Policy is an important tool not only for assisting the City in making informed decisions, but also for demonstrating, in a way that is timeless, the City's commitment to protecting the environment. The action plans resulting from the process will serve to guide the City's environmental actions in the coming years.

"The environment is at the heart of the municipal administration's concerns. We have been doing a significant amount of work in this direction and it is important to continue to do so. Think of Harwood Nature Park, the vast green space that the City acquired last year to ensure its preservation, the planting of some 600 trees annually in public spaces, or the many subsidies offered to our citizens. These are just a few examples of the initiatives undertaken over the years," explained Mayor Guy Pilon.

The public is invited to complete the survey, which can be found in the Environmental Policy section at ville.vaudreuil-dorion.qc.ca, by August 28th. Citizens will also have the opportunity to express their views on the subject during the *Les Fêtes de quartier* neighbourhood events, which will be taking place Wednesday evenings until August 24th in different parks across the territory.
