Maison Félix-Leclerc Debuts its Fall Program this Friday!

Vaudreuil-Dorion, September 8, 2022 – On this coming Friday, September 9th, Maison Félix-Leclerc will be opening its doors to visitors for the fall season. Everyone will have the opportunity to attend Friday theme nights as well as visit the artists in residence and enjoy a variety of exhibitions.

Artist Isabelle Thibert is settling in for the month of September and is ready to take advantage of Félix's inspiring home to carry out her residency project, which will later be exhibited in October. The artist will also offer workshops on Sunday afternoons during which participants will each have the pleasure of creating a small format canvas. Julie de Belle and Jean-Noël Bilodeau will follow suit in October and November.

Friday theme nights

Stéphan Daigle will start off the evening activity season at Maison Félix-Leclerc with his literary cabaret. On September 9th, Stéphan will welcome reader Henriette Milard and poets Julie de Belle and Leslie Piché. Two additional literary evenings will take place on October 14th and November 11th. During Jasette chez Félix nights, Camille Deslauriers Ménard will read the story entitled *Les malheurs de Loki*, by Countess de Vilmur on September 23rd. In theatre, *Le Dieu du carnage*, by Yasmina Reza, will be presented on September 30th by barre/oblique. In music, *Le Cercle des conteurs du Haut-Saint-Laurent* will be back at Maison Félix-Leclerc to present *Ronde de chansons* (depuis 1992) on October 7th, and André Champagne will host a Holiday evening on November 25th. Lastly, Michel Proulx of the Club photo Vaudreuil-Dorion will present a conference on cell phone photography entitled *La photo de voyage, paysages et nature avec un téléphone cellulaire* on October 21st. Evenings begin at 7:30 p.m. and are free of charge.

Exhibitions

Again, this autumn, guests will be treated to more beautiful exhibitions worth a visit. Each of the artists in residence will present their project in the Adagio Room. The Allegro room, for its part, will be dedicated to citizen exhibitions, beginning with works by Roxane Bilodeau (until October 30th) and Ereny Mekhail (November 4th to December 18th). Pierre Arsenault will exhibit throughout the fall *Le p'tit bonheur* room.
