Feux et flocons: An evening of fun, music and fireworks at Parc de la Maison-Valois

Vaudreuil-Dorion, January 31, 2023 – The City of Vaudreuil-Dorion is inviting the population to attend this year's *Feux et flocons* event that will take place on Saturday, February 25th at 7 p.m., at *Parc de la Maison-Valois*. DJ's *Monsieur PY* and *Adrien Tosti* will both be on hand performing from the MIXBUS Studio roof, a former school bus converted into a stage.

“*Feux et flocons* has become a not-to-be-missed winter event in Vaudreuil-Dorion and citizens continue to look forward to it with great excitement each year. This year, we are thrilled to welcome Pierre-Yves Lord, a radio and television host many are familiar with, but whose talents as a DJ are perhaps less well known. This will be a great opportunity for this amazing communicator to let us see another side of him,” says Vincent Bastien, Director of Recreation and Culture.

As soon as the site opens at 7 p.m., DJ *Adrien Tosti* - who we got to know at the costume party on October 29th at the *Opticentre St-Jean-Baptiste* - will perform for the first part of the event until 8:15 p.m., after which Pierre-Yves Lord - also known by his stage name *Monsieur PY*, will take over the turntable. Thanks to his great musical wisdom, this DJ will have no trouble appealing to fans of nostalgic music and fans of recent hits alike. The famous fireworks display will light up the sky around 9 p.m. and *Monsieur PY* will continue to entertain the crowd until 10:30 p.m.

Starting at 7 p.m., *La Caravane Mozaïk* will also be on site in techno mode to host an impressive and skilfully designed decoding workshop created by *Le Lab*.

Hungry event-goers will be able to buy a variety of sweet and salty snacks from two food trucks as well as alcoholic drinks from the bar. Coffee and hot chocolate will also be served for free. Please note that alcohol brought in from outside is not permitted on the site.
