## Rehabilitation of boulevard de la Cité-des-Jeunes : Ville de Vaudreuil-Dorion receives \$3 million in financial assistance

**Vaudreuil-Dorion, April 16, 2025 –** The Ville de Vaudreuil-Dorion is pleased to announce that the *Ministère des Transports et de la Mobilité durable du Québec* (MTMD) has awarded it a grant of up to \$3 million for its project to upgrade a section of boulevard de la Cité-des-Jeunes, between rue des Floralies and rue Henry-Ford. This financial assistance is awarded under the support component of the *Programme d'aide* à *la voirie locale - 2025-2026*. Work is scheduled for summer 2025.

The funded portion of the project consists of the complete rehabilitation of this 1.3 km segment of the boulevard. At the end, it will comprise two lanes in each direction, separated by a concrete island. In addition, to ensure maximum safety for the most vulnerable users, the project incorporates vegetated lanes, a bicycle path and a sidewalk.

"Mobility is extremely important in a vast territory like ours. That's why our government is stepping up its efforts to improve and maintain our roads in every region of Quebec. This investment in Vaudreuil-Dorion is a fine example. I'm delighted to see that our collaboration is enabling our partners to take action to make travel safer and more sustainable for everyone."
