Réseau Mozaïk: a more up-to-date and attractive website

Vaudreuil-Dorion, July 4, 2025 – Vaudreuil-Dorion's cultural platform par excellence, *Réseau Mozaïk*, has recently undergone a facelift to provide a more fluid user experience and content that is more in tune with the reality and needs of the community.

In particular, the City has chosen to highlight its cultural organisations and local artists with the addition of two new showcases devoted entirely to them. There's also a more dynamic interface and improved access to the essentials: the diary, videos, the caravan, the newspaper and podcasts.

An art trail redesigned into four routes

The 70 or so works of art in the area are now divided into four routes: *Sur Harwood*, *Le Centre*, *Périphérie* and *Urbain*. Each route is accompanied by clear indications of the distance and time needed to cover it, depending on the visitor's preferred mode of travel. Another new feature is an interactive map integrated into each work sheet, enabling visitors to see the entire route and identify nearby art projects.

"The site is an even better reflection of Vaudreuil-Dorion's vibrant cultural scene. It provides intuitive, lively access to all the richness of our community, as well as giving visibility to the remarkable work of our local artists and organisations," says Karine Marin, *cheffe de section arts et culture* at *Ville de Vaudreuil-Dorion*.

Launched in June 2023, the art trail aims to showcase works of art in outdoor public spaces, as well as inside municipal buildings and partner premises. It allows people to discover not only the works of art, but also the stories and artistic approaches behind them. Thanks to posters equipped with QR codes, citizens can consult enriched digital content, such as photos, videos and texts, simply by using their smartphone. It's all available on the web too.
